Come hither, my Teresa...

One of the artist's goals with this work is to find a specific or effective point that can agglomerate the strength and fleetingness of the performance with the permanence of the installation. The sum of these two art categories create a third, which the artist calls instauration.

The invented community of Puente Mexico, Tijuana: participation and acceptance in the public art project by Felipe Barbosa and Rosana Ricalde on the border between two worlds Luiz Sérgio de Oliveira

In a scene of perplexities between the US and Latin American border, Rio artists Felipe Barbosa and Rosana Ricalde performed their art project Hospitality/Hospitalidad with the fluctuating community of Puente Mexico (Tijuana), a most unlikely community when addressed through conventional models or even by understanding our common sense.

Reprint: From Anthropophagy to Tropicália Carlos Zilio

From Anthropophagy to Tropicália, published in 1982, was the outcome of the seminar on 'The national and folk in Brazilian culture' organized by Adauto Novaes in Funarte in 1981. This article, one of the first projects after the death of Hélio Oiticica in 1980, was an attempt to support the dissemination of his work, which we knew was able to demonstrate an original striking relationship with the contemporary. It was also an offshoot of my inquiry into nationalism in Brazilian art after analyzing Modernism in my book A querela do Brasil.

Successes and failures when art changes

In this article, when recounting some of the experiences in the *Projeto Outros Caminhos* (Other Roads Project) almost thirty years later, in public schools in California at the end of the 1960s, the author assesses the change in the frontiers of art with everyday life, putting for discussion the boundaries between art and education.

Redoing passports: visual thought in the discussion on multiculturalism

In one of the most useful studies on the relationship between art production, identity and transnationality, the author discusses issues relating to the place of the works by Latin American artists in the USA-Europe-Japan panorama of world galleries and markets, in the early 1990s, when the world experienced the first globalization movement. The analyses of some artists' works addressing questions relating to frontiers, national identities and aesthetics of transience reveal the deterritorialized visual thought of that time.

Art and September 11

The article written two months after the terrorist attack on New York's twin towers asks whether the purpose of art is always to react to events by doing art or should it only correspond to living reality by preserving the memory and way in which societies deal with sudden death and its inclusion in public life.

Rethinking the West

A. Raghuramaraju

The article examines the historic and conceptual formation of the term West, and the meaning it acquires with the advent of modernity, questioning the way in which this process is understood by some authors. By comparing the dynamics of colonialism (not the West), it discusses its consequent need to consolidate identity through the relationship of otherness.
