We are pleased to submit a short communication entitled "NEST BOXES USE, POLYGYNY AND POSSIBLE INFANTICIDE IN A GROUP OF THE BLACK LION TAMARIN (*Leontopithecus chrysopygus*)", for consideration for publication in the *Oecologia Australis*.

In this manuscript, we report the supply of nest boxes in the wild to the black lion tamarin, the first record of use of the nest boxes in the wild by the black lion tamarin group, the first record of polygyny to wild black lion tamarin, and the possible first case of infanticide reported in the genus *Leontopithecus*.

These new information regard black lion tamarin behavior and ecology may be useful to promote researches and actions of the management in modified landscapes aiming the species conservation and also to direct news researches regarding mating system models in lion tamarins. For this reason, we believe that this manuscript is appropriate for publication in *Oecologia Australis* and should be of interest to a broad readership, including those interested in behavior, ecology, primatology, and endangered species conservation.
