

Scientific Production and Knowledge Dissemination at the XI ANERJ Congress of Neurology: a partnership with the Revista Brasileira de Neurologia (RBN/UFRJ)

The XI Congress of Neurology of the Association of Neurologists of the State of Rio de Janeiro (ANERJ), held on October 31 and November 1, 2025, consolidated itself as a center of excellence for scientific dissemination, the exchange of clinical experiences, and the promotion of research in neurology, bringing together specialists, residents, and students from different institutions.

Within the scientific program of the congress, special emphasis was given to the presentation of scientific papers and clinical case reports, submitted in poster and oral presentation formats. The works covered a wide range of topics, reflecting the complexity and multidisciplinary nature of contemporary neurology, including areas such as clinical neurology, neuroimmunology, epilepsy, neuromuscular diseases, neurovascular disorders, neurodegenerative diseases, neurogenetics, headache and pain, palliative care, and interfaces with other medical specialties.

The submission and evaluation process followed rigorous technical criteria, based on originality, scientific relevance, methodological clarity, and contribution to clinical practice or to the advancement of neurological knowledge.

The oral presentations and poster sessions provided rich moments of scientific discussion, allowing direct interaction between authors and evaluators. A total of 92 works were submitted, of which 81 were approved, including 37 scientific studies and 44 case reports.

As a way to recognize and encourage scientific production, the two winning works in each category—oral presentation and poster—were selected for publication in the Revista Brasileira de Neurologia, Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro (RBN/UFRJ) in the form of extended abstracts, allowing greater methodological detail and presentation of results. The remaining approved works were published as abstracts, ensuring visibility and formal registration of the scientific production presented at the event.

This initiative reinforces ANERJ's commitment to fostering research and continuing education, in addition to encouraging the active participation of young researchers and clinicians in the construction of neurological knowledge. The publication of the works presented at the XI Congress represents not only academic recognition but also an important instrument for scientific dissemination within the Brazilian neurological community.

This achievement underscores the importance of the partnership between ANERJ and the RBN/UFRJ.
